GIVERS AND TAKERS (PART 2)

During this time of year many of us think about giving gifts and thanks because we celebrate the Thanksgiving, Christmas and other significant holidays. A few years ago, the congregation of Home Assembly Church (my church home) was incredibly thankful that the Lord blessed us to be in our own sanctuary so we could have our annual Thanksgiving Service year.
