A TOUGH GIVER

"Speak the truth in love..." Ephesians 4:15 KJV

It's really a great feeling to give and there are so many ways to do it. Giving isn't always about money as there are so many things we've been given by God to give to others. One particular thing we can give is the truth.

It's noted, people often have difficulty giving money to help someone. Another difficulty people have is being willing to give 'the truth' to people in need of help. Real love, when helping others, must be packaged in truth. While growing up, my parents would tell me things I didn't want to hear. Their love made them a tough giver of truth in order to help me develop into a person of integrity. When we have to dispense unpleasant truth to others in need of our help, I call that being a 'tough giver' because it takes fortitude and strength from God to risk receiving someone's anger toward you for speaking the truth in love.
