

EMPOWERED TO SERVE

Jesus came to earth to serve not be served. As followers of Christ we are to adopt this same mind set. The ultimate level of service He performed was dying on the cross. Before facing death Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane and asked the Father if there was another way to fulfill this task but realized as God's vessel the will of the Father had to supersede his own desire. Thus he concludes saying, "Nevertheless, not my will but Thy will be done." Be sure to tithe and give offerings to support your church. Share with those in need as directed by the Holy Ghost. The nature of God is to give and we should follow that same pattern. As you give, God will always keep you supplied.

There is power in our **touch**. Jesus was never reluctant to touch those he helped. In Matthew 19:13-14 Jesus wants to touch the children by putting His hands on them to pray for them. A hug can heal a broken heart, kind words can touch a lonely heart, and a warm smile can touch one's life and bring a spark to their day.

Our God empowers us to serve Him by serving others using time, talent, treasure and touch. Seek Him how to employ this in your daily walk so we make a marked difference in the world.
