*"You will show me the path of life: In Your presence is fullness of joy;
At your right hand are pleasures forevermore." – Psalm 16:11*

How often have I asked the question of the Lord as to where is He; do You really care; do You really hear me? I would be blinded by the trees in the forest. Yes, the trees are the cluttered thoughts in the forest of my mind. I allowed myself to be plagued by my circumstances and it would lead me to conclude that God was not with me. I felt as though He left me behind. Dealing with life is an experience all the living must confront on a daily basis.
