"And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character and character, hope." Romans 5:3-4, NKJV



Basically the Word teaches us that trouble produces endurance in us to continue in the race until we finish our course and see Jesus in the finale, which is our desire. Paul is often referred to as mentioning he had finished his course and kept the faith, which he spoke before he died.
