Psalm 106:13 (AMPC)



This Psalm recaps how the Lord delivered, protected and provided for Israel when He set them free from Egypt. And it also reveals their failure to properly and consistently respond to the Lord, knowing He did everything for them. When I read verse 13 the words leaped from the page when it stated, "they did not earnestly wait for His plans to develop regarding them." I saw myself in those words. life, I've discovered there is still a lack of waiting in other areas. Primarily the area of lack is believing consistently that He will supply all my needs.
